Over the past five years, the college has undertaken numerous initiatives and activities aimed at promoting these values. These efforts not only enhance the students' awareness and understanding but also contribute positively to the broader community, reinforcing the college's commitment to creating a more inclusive and equitable society.

1 Initiatives by National Service Scheme-2023-24

The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of The Cochin College has had a remarkably active and impactful academic year 2023-2024, marked by a diverse array of programs and initiatives. Through activities ranging from environmental conservation efforts and health awareness campaigns to cultural celebrations and educational outreach, the NSS unit has demonstrated a strong commitment to community service and national development. Under the dedicated guidance of NSS Program Officers Mr. Renjith S and Dr. Soney Bhageeradhan, the volunteers have embraced the NSS motto "Not Me, But You," prioritizing the needs of the community and working tirelessly to make a positive impact. This document provides a comprehensive overview of the NSS activities carried out during the academic year. It high-lights the various events and initiatives undertaken by the unit, showcasing the enthusiasm and dedication of the volunteers in promoting social welfare, environmental sustainability, and cultural enrichment. The successful execution of these programs reflects the collaborative efforts of students, faculty, and external partners, all working together to foster a sense of civic responsibility and community engagement.

1.1 Environment Day Celebration

Date: 5^{th} June 2023

Cochin

The NSS unit of The Cochin College celebrated Environment Day by planting 30 fruit saplings on the campus. The event was inaugurated by the Principal, Dr. M. Geetha, at 10 am near the basketball court. The program saw a good turnout of teachers and the participation of 60 volunteers. NSS Program Officers Mr. Renjith S and Dr. Soney Bhageer-adhan coordinated the event. Following the tree plantation, the event included the inauguration of the "Malinya Muk-

halkeralam, Navakeralam" initiative. This was accompanied by a campus cleaning drive aimed at raising awareness



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about the harmful effects of plastic waste. The program concluded at 12:30 pm.

1.4 "Clean My Village" project at Kodakara

As part of this initiative, Dr. Manju V Subramanian served as the resource person for an awareness session on waste management. Her session focused on promoting safer menstrual practices, including the use of menstrual cups, to encourage sustainable and hygienic alternatives. This initiative not only contributed to the cleanliness of the village but also aimed to educate the community on important health and environmental practices.





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1.5 Nature Education Camp: Silent Valley National Park

First-year B.Sc Zoology students, in association with the Nature Club, participated in a three-day nature camp from 16th to 18th November 2023, at Silent Valley National Park, Mannarkkad, and Attappadi. Funded by the Kerala Forests and Wildlife Department and co-funded by the DBT Star College Scheme, the camp included bird-watching walks, where notable sightings such as the Malabar Trogon, Nilgiri Wood Pigeon, and the Great Indian Hornbill were observed. A session by forest officials emphasized the "Leave No Trace" policy, and a visit to the Attappadi landscape showcased the barren lands resulting from deforestation and improper land use. This highlighted the importance of sustainable practices to prevent ecological disasters. During the interactions with the Silent Valley tribal community, the tribes shared their deep connection with the forest and their traditional knowledge of the ecosystem which has been passed down through generations. It underscored the significance of preserving both the natural environment and the cultural heritage of the region.






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1.6 Training on Organic Farming and Bio-Waste Management

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
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1.17 Gandhi Jayanti week observance


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1.38 Women's Day Celebration

Conclusion of NSS Activities for the Academic Year 2023-2024



2.1.1 SHARP Project:



This initiative aimed to promote environmental sustainability through effective waste management practices. The Zoology students played a crucial role in the collection, sorting, and categorising of recyclable materials, as well as educating the community on the importance of recycling and proper waste disposal at Aluva, Kalamassery, JLN Stadium, MG Road and Vytilla Metro Stations.



2.1.2 ECHO Project:

Cochin

Four students and one faculty member from the Department of Zoology, The Cochin College participated in the ECHO Bootcamp on 22nd and 23rd September 2023, at Christ University Nodal Office, Thiruvananthapuram. ECHO 2023 is





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a platform designed to empower young individuals to harness their innovation and entrepreneurial skills to drive positive change and create a significant environmental impact. 2.1.3 Zonal Zoo fest:

The Department of Zoology, The Cochin College in association with the Zoological Society of Kerala and co-funded by the DBT Star College Scheme, organized the Zonal Zoo FEST 2023 on 20th October 2023 at The Cochin College. The event saw participation from 106 students representing seven colleges: The Cochin College, St. Teresa's College Ernakulam, St. Albert's College Ernakulam, Maharaja's College Ernakulam, Bharata Mata College Ernakulam, Sacred Heart College, and St. Xavier's College Vaikom. The Fest featured nine different competitions for undergraduate students, fostering a spirit of academic and extracurricular excellence. ZOOFEST 2023 was inaugurated by Prof. Dr. Mohan Joseph Modayil, Fisheries Adviser Consultant, and Senior Adviser to the Government of Andhra Pradesh, who also engaged with students about career opportunities in the Life Sciences. The highlight of the event was The Cochin College winning The A K Prema ever-rolling trophy for accumulating the highest points in the competitions, underscoring the college's commitment to academic and extracurricular distinction.





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2.1.4 DROP (Drive to Recover Ocean Plastics):

On 31st January 2024, students from the Department of Zoology along with the Bhoomitrasena Club of The Cochin College performed an impactful street play at Munambam Harbour, Kochi, to raise awareness about Plan@earth's 'DROP: Drive to Recover Ocean Plastics' project. Through their compelling performance, they highlighted the critical issue of ocean plastic pollution and the urgent need for collective action to address it. Additionally, they created stunning wall art to further educate the public about the detrimental effects of plastic on marine environments and to inspire community involvement in saving our oceans from plastic pollution. Their efforts were met with great appreciation from the local community, underscoring the importance of environmental conservation.





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2.1.5 Citizen Science Program (REVIVAL) (Rehabilitation of Vibrio Infested Waters of Vembanad Lake- Pollution and Solution):

In a bid to promote citizen science initiatives, the Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute (CMFRI) launched the REVIVAL project (Rehabilitation of Vibrio Infested Waters of Vembanad Lake - Pollution and Solution). This multi-institutional research project invited college students and the public to participate in optical mapping of the Vembanad Lake. The project's objectives include understanding the extent of pathogenic Vibrio pollution, identifying their reservoirs in the ecosystem, mapping the distribution of Vibrio carriers using remote-sensing techniques, and developing forecast models to anticipate microbial infection hotspots. Data collection was facilitated using a Secchi disc, a simple hand-held device to measure water turbidity, and a mobile app named TurbAqua was developed for uploading the data. On 8th November 2023, 32 first-year UG students from the Department of Zoology, The Cochin College attended an orientation session for the Citizen Science Program organised by Ms. Ancy C Stoy, a Research Scholar at CMFRI, where Secchi disks were distributed. The students also underwent a comprehensive training session at CMFRI on 24th January 2024, equipping them with the skills necessary to contribute effectively to this important environmental initiative.





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2.1.6 Nature Education Camp: Silent Valley National Park

First-year B.Sc Zoology students, in association with the Nature Club, participated in a three-day nature camp from 16th to 18th November 2023, at Silent Valley National Park, Mannarkkad, and Attappadi. Funded by the Kerala Forests Wildlife Department and co-funded by the DBT Star College Scheme, the camp included bird-watching walks, where notable sightings such as the Malabar Trogon, Nilgiri Wood Pigeon, and the Great Indian Hornbill were observed. A session by forest officials emphasized the "Leave No Trace" policy, and a visit to the Attappadi landscape showcased the barren lands resulting from deforestation and improper land use. This highlighted the importance of sustainable practices to prevent ecological disasters. During the interactions with the Silent Valley tribal community, the tribes shared their deep connection with the forest and their traditional knowledge of the ecosystem which has been passed down through generations. It underscored the significance of preserving both the natural environment and the cultural heritage of the region.






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2.1.7 Institute Visit:


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
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2.8 Department of Chemistry




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2.9 Anti Narcotic Cell






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2.11.2 International Peace G20 Youth Summit 2023:


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3.10 Gandhi Jayanthi Celebrations: Visit to preschool, kochi

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
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3.21 Girl Child Day


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3.28 Beach for All Campaign


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dedication to making a positive impact on the lives of disadvantaged individuals.

4.1 Department of Zoology

4.1.1 World Environment Day:

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4.1.2 World AIDS Day:

This practical session aimed to educate students on the environmental and economic benefits of vermicomposting, emphasizing its role in reducing organic waste and enhancing soil fertility. By engaging in this activity, students gained valuable skills in creating and managing composting systems, which they can implement in their personal lives and future careers. The workshop not only promoted eco-friendly practices but also reinforced the importance of sustainability and resource conservation, preparing students to contribute positively to environmental stewardship.



4.2 Department of Economics

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4.2.1 Career Orientation Classes for school children:

On June 29, 2022, the Department of Economics at The Cochin College conducted career orientation classes for plus two students at Bhavan's Munshi Vidyashram, Thiruvamkulam. These sessions aimed to provide valuable career guid-





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ance and insights into various fields of study and professional opportunities available after completing their higher secondary education. The sessions included discussions on the importance of choosing the right career path, the various career options in economics and related fields, and the skills required to excel in these areas. Expert speakers and faculty members from the department shared their experiences and provided practical advice on how to navigate the transition from school to higher education and the job market. By engaging with the students, the department sought to inspire and equip them with the knowledge and confidence needed to make informed decisions about their future careers. This initiative not only highlighted the diverse opportunities in the field of economics but also emphasized the importance of strategic career planning for achieving long-term success.



4.2.2 11th Agricultural Census 2023:

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Along with the Department of Economics, the data collection for the agricultural census in divisions 7, 8, 9, 10, and 25 of Cochin Corporation under the Kochi Taluk limits was conducted by the staff of the Kochi Taluk Statistical Office and the NSS Programme Officers—Dr. Manju V Subramanian, Mr. Renjith S., and NSS volunteers of The Cochin College—on January 28, 30, and 31, 2023. A dedicated group of 85 volunteers participated in this extensive data collection effort. Initiated by the Food and Agriculture Committee of the United Nations, the Union Ministry of Agriculture has been conducting a continuous agricultural census every five years since 1970-71 across all states and Union Territories of India. The primary goal of this survey is to equip local governments with detailed data necessary for formulating plans aimed at enhancing the prosperity of farmers and the agricultural sector, developing innovative projects in the tea industry, and aiding in policy formulation in the social and economic domains. In Kerala, the Department of Economic Status and Statistics oversees the survey. For the 11th Agricultural Census 2021-2022, information was collected





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using a mobile app, with enumerators visiting every household in each local self-government body within the district, ensuring comprehensive and accurate data collection.



4.3 Department of English

4.3.1 Understanding Communication Barriers:

On February 13, 2023, as part of an extension activity, students from the Department of English conducted a survey to understand the communication problems faced by tourists visiting the Biennale in Fort Kochi. The survey aimed to assess the difficulties tourists encounter while communicating in English with tour guides. A comprehensive questionnaire consisting of 15 Yes/No questions was utilised, focusing on various aspects of oral communication such as pronunciation, fluency, grammar, vocabulary, and clarity. This activity successfully identified several communication barriers faced by tourists. Addressing these issues through targeted training and continuous improvement initiatives can significantly enhance the overall experience for international visitors, ensuring a more enjoyable and informative visit to the Biennale.





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4.4 Department of Chemistry

4.4.1 Ozone Day Extension Activity:




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5.5 Awareness Class "Say Yes to Life and No to Drugs"


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7.2 Yoga session






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8.3.2 2 Webinar on information and technology


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8.4 BioBlitz

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- 10 Initiatives for Communal and Socio-economic Inclusiveness by Various Clubs and Committees :2019-20
- 10.1 BIOMAG Community Based Solid Waste Management through Re-Cycling and Up-Cycling In an Adopted Ward Of Corporation of Kochi, Kerala, India.

The BIOMAG project was aimed at creating awareness among the public particularly the residents of ward VII of Kochi Corporation about the need to manage plastic waste properly. A consumer state like Kerala has a high per capita generation of plastic waste. This is particularly true in a city like Kochi. The project was perceived as relevant by the Department of Zoology of The Cochin College because of the coastal proximity of Kochi Corporation. Domestic plastic waste that is not managed properly will invariably find its way to the ocean through the storm-water drains and other public dumps especially during the rainy season. Thus it will become a threat to various species of marine life. On land also the dumps and litter lying around results in other threats to animal life through ingestion by birds, cows and other animals. Leaching from dumpsites like Brahmapuram leads to the contamination of ground water by additives and synthetic dyes used as colouring agents.

The Department of Zoology of The Cochin College took up this project as an Outreach project that can be steered by the students of the department under the guidance of the teachers. The main tasks of awareness creation and sensitization about the need to dispose plastic waste properly was undertaken by the students and teachers through door to door visits to the households of the ward and one on one explanation to the residents. Public activities like street plays and skits were also planned to spread awareness. Workshops were conducted on other methods to manage plastic waste such as

educe, reuse and refuse. Do It Yourself (DIY) workshops were also conducted for the public on how to make their own



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shopping bags from used clothing. Workshops were also conducted on how to do home composting of kitchen waste. The Project was not only aimed at giving awareness and sensitizing the target group about reduce, reuse and refuse strategies but went one step further in offering recycling solutions as well. It was fully understood that despite reduce, reuse and refuse strategies there is inevitably generation of plastic waste in every household particularly due to the fact that every item of food and grocery, from food grains to soap, comes in plastic packaging. Hence it was imperative that for the project to have an impact, recycling options too have to be provided to the public. For this purpose, the Department of Zoology engaged a reliable agency that has considerable experience in the field of door to door collection of plastic waste, followed by grading and finally dispatch for recycling. The agency selected for this was PlanatEarth a non-profit agency based in Aluva.

The recycling solution that was offered to the target community proved to be the main aspect of the project for the public was offered both strategies to reduce the per household generation of waste as well as a way to ensure that whatever plastic waste that is still generated gets collected and recycled. Total 5547 kg of plastic waste has been removed. Some non-recyclables have to be despatched to cement manufacturers for use for use as RDF. This process incurs charges.

The project got widely accepted and was published in American Journal of Multidisciplinary Research Development (AJMRD).

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10.2 CUBE Student Scientist Program-2019

The Department of Zoology at The Cochin College, recognized as a CUBE Model Systems Research and Development Center by CUBE-TIFR, Mumbai, launched the 'Student Scientist Program' in 2019 to inspire young minds to consider careers in basic science. This initiative aimed to train students in the methodology of scientific research, including experiment design, data collection, and effective communication of findings. A total of 13 students from six schools in West Kochi—St. Mary's AIGHS, Fortkochi; St. Paul's Public School, Fortkochi; Fatima GHS, Fortkochi; St. John De Britto HS, Fortkochi; and TDHS, Mattancherry—registered for the program. The two-day intensive training, held on July 23-24, 2019, provided both students and their teachers with hands-on experience in the department's lab facilities and included two mini projects to be completed over the following three months.
