1 EXTENSION ACTIVITIES THROUGH NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

1.1 FortKochi Beach Cleaning


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1.4 Awareness Class on Immunity and Personal Hygiene


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1.5 Awareness Class "Say Yes to Life and No to Drugs"

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

d information science, preparing them for dynamic and fulfilling roles in the field.




