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## 1 FEEDBACK MECHANISM AT THE COCHIN COLLEGE

### 1.1 Overview

The Cochin College has developed a comprehensive feedback system to collect valuable insights from students, alumni, teachers, and employers. This feedback mechanism is essential for pinpointing strengths and areas that require improvement, thereby facilitating enhancements in educational offerings and overall institutional performance.

### 1.2 Feedback Collection

Feedback is collected at the end of each academic year from a variety of stakeholders. The process involves both offline methods and online surveys using Google Forms. The Feedback Committee designs a detailed questionnaire featuring a series of 5-point rating scale questions. These questions cover aspects such as curriculum, academic performance, the learning environment, and overall satisfaction. The questionnaire is reviewed and approved annually by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) to ensure its relevance and effectiveness.

### 1.3 Feedback Analysis

The IQAC gathers data from the feedback forms and consolidates it into a comprehensive summary report. This report highlights general areas for improvement without delving into department-specific feedback, ensuring a broad overview of the institution's performance. By focusing on overall trends and common themes, the IQAC can identify key strengths and weaknesses that are relevant across the entire college. This approach allows for a more holistic understanding of the institution's performance and helps prioritize actions that will have the most significant impact. The summary report is then used as a basis for developing action plans aimed at addressing the identified areas for improvement, ensuring that the feedback loop is effectively closed and continuous improvement is achieved.

### 1.4 Action Plan

Once the feedback is analyzed, each department assesses the feedback and makes appropriate adjustments to the curriculum, teaching methods, or infrastructure. Departments then prepare and submit Action Taken Reports to the IQAC. The IQAC consolidates these reports into an institutional action report, which is submitted to college council. This structured approach ensures that feedback is effectively addressed and used to drive continuous improvement.





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## 1.5 Communication

The results of the feedback analysis and the subsequent action plans are communicated to stakeholders through various channels. These include the college website, email notifications, and notice boards, ensuring that all stakeholders are informed about the improvements and changes made based on their feedback.

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## Overall Feedback Analysis (2020-21)

### 2 CURRICULUM FEEDBACK - STUDENTS

- Mode of feedback Collection : Online through Google forms
- Target Group : Students of The Cochin College
- Number of responses received : 329

The college conducted a student feedback survey on the curriculum, consisting of six statements rated on a 5-point scale. Five statements ranged from Excellent to Poor, while the sixth used a Yes (5 points) to No (0 point) scale. The feedback covered various aspects, including course content depth, coverage breadth, syllabus competencies, unit organization, adequacy of textbooks, and awareness of Program Outcomes (PO), Program Specific Outcomes (PSO), and Course Outcomes (CO). The table below summarizes the analysis, highlighting student perceptions and pinpointing areas for improvement

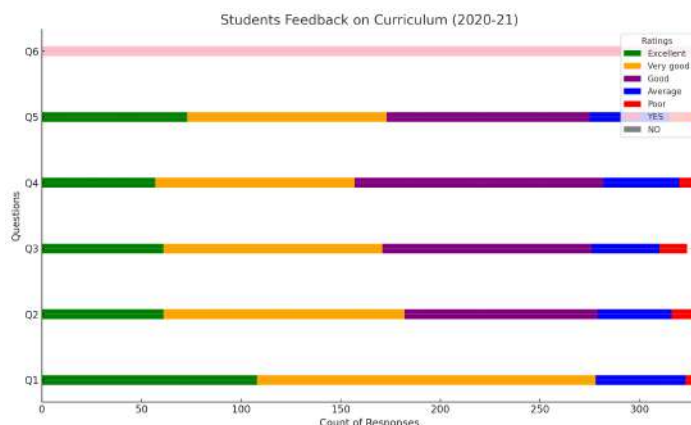
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## 2.2 Analysis Summary

The student feedback on the curriculum for 2020-21 indicates a generally positive perception. The depth of course content, adequacy of textbooks, and overall awareness of Program Outcomes (PO), Program Specific Outcomes (PSO), and Course Outcomes (CO) received high scores, with awareness scoring an exceptional 4.96. However, areas such as coverage and time allotted for courses (3.55), alignment of the syllabus with competencies (3.48), and the division and sequence of units (3.48) suggest room for improvement. Enhancing course depth, better managing time, aligning the syllabus more closely with required competencies, and improving the logical flow of units are recommended to further strengthen the curriculum.

## 3 TEACHERS' FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM

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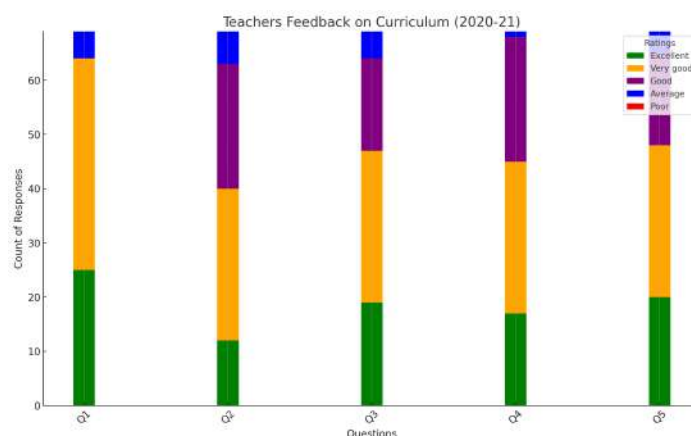

## 3.2 Analysis Summary

The feedback from teachers on the curriculum for 2020-21 indicates a generally positive perception. The depth of course content, including practical aspects, received the highest mean score of 4.22, reflecting strong satisfaction in this area. The adequacy of textbooks and reference books was also rated positively, with a mean score of 3.93. Both the alignment of the syllabus with expected competencies and the division and sequence of units in the syllabus were rated at 3.88, indicating moderate satisfaction. The extent of coverage and time allotted for the courses received the lowest score of 3.67, suggesting that there may be room for improvement in this area. Overall, the teachers' feedback highlights strengths in the depth of course content and adequacy of reference materials, while also pointing out potential areas for enhancement in course coverage and scheduling.





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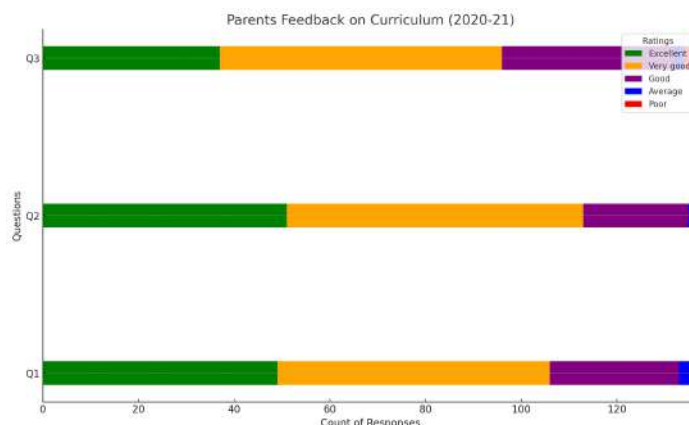
## 4 PARENTS' FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM

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quality of teaching at the institution was rated slightly higher, with a mean score of 4.18, suggesting that parents are pleased with the teaching methods and effectiveness of the faculty. The learning outcomes achieved by students from the programme received a mean score of 3.91, indicating that while the outcomes are viewed positively, there is room for improvement to ensure that students fully achieve the expected competencies. Overall, the data reflects a positive view of the curriculum from the parents' perspective, with teaching quality being a particular strength. However, focusing on enhancing the learning outcomes could further improve the curriculum's effectiveness.

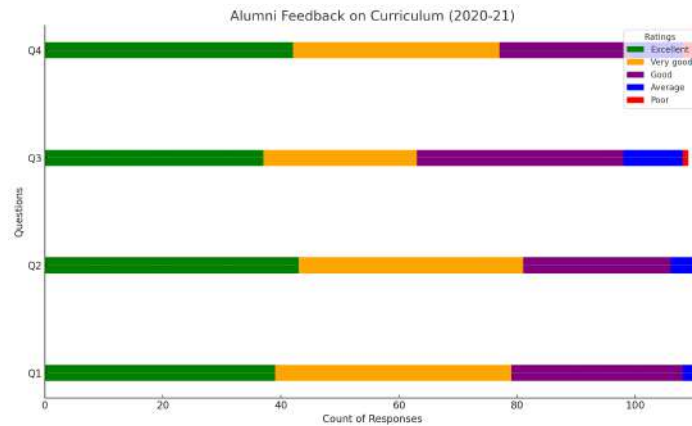
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## 5.2 Analysis Summary

The feedback from alumni on the curriculum at The Cochin College is generally positive, with the prescribed curriculum receiving a mean score of 4.04 and course content delivery scoring 4.07, indicating satisfaction with the curriculum's structure and teaching methods. However, the relevance of their degree to current jobs received a slightly lower mean score of 3.81, suggesting that while many alumni find their education applicable to their careers, there is room for improvement in aligning the curriculum with job market demands. The activities organized for overall development were rated 3.94, reflecting a recognition of their value but also indicating potential for these activities to be more impactful. Overall, alumni perceive the curriculum favorably, with specific areas identified for further enhancement to better connect academic experiences with career relevance and personal development.

## 6 EMPLOYER FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM

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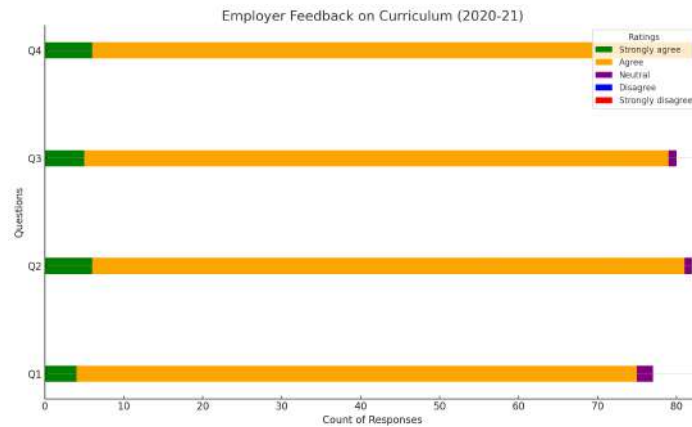

## 6.2 Analysis Summary

The development of human values and ethics and the promotion of innovative thinking were both rated highly, with mean scores of 4.06 and 4.05 respectively, reflecting the curriculum's success in fostering essential values and encouraging creative thinking. Additionally, the curriculum's effectiveness in developing skill-oriented human resources received a mean score of 4.06, indicating that it is viewed as strong in preparing students with practical skills needed in the workforce. Overall, employers' feedback highlights the curriculum's strengths in imparting relevant knowledge, developing values and ethics, promoting innovation, and enhancing practical skills.
