#### Green Initiatives Undertaken by The Cochin College

#### 1 Implementation of the Green Protocol

#### 1.1 Overview of the Green Protocol

The Green Protocol, introduced in 2019, marked a pivotal step in the college's journey toward sustainability. It established guidelines and practices aimed at minimizing the environmental impact of the college's operations.

#### 1.2 Key Components of the Green Protocol

#### 1.2.1 Ban on Single-Use Plastics

The college eliminated single-use plastics, replacing them with sustainable alternatives like cloth bags, reusable bottles, and metal cutlery.

#### 1.2.2 Sustainable Events

All college events adhere to the Green Protocol, emphasizing reduced paper usage, eco-friendly materials, and responsible waste management.

#### 1.2.3 Waste Segregation and Recycling

The protocol introduced systematic waste segregation at the source, with bins designated for degradable, non-degradable, and hazardous waste. Collaborations with NGOs like PlanatEarth ensure that paper, plastic, and e-waste are recycled responsibly.

#### 1.2.4 Energy Conservation

Energy-efficient lighting and solar panels were installed across the campus to reduce reliance on non-renewable energy sources.

#### 1.2.5 Reduction of Paper Use through E-Governance

To further support sustainability, the college has embraced e-governance, particularly in its paperless approach to AQAR (Annual Quality Assurance Report) and SSR (Self Study Report) data collection and compilation. This initiative significantly reduces paper usage by digitizing processes and promoting electronic communication and record-keeping.

In 2023, The Cochin College conducted a Green Audit to evaluate the effectiveness of its environmental initiatives and identify areas for improvement. The audit assessed various aspects of the college's environmental practices, including energy consumption, waste management, water usage, and biodiversity.

#### 2.2 Key Findings of the Green Audit

#### 2.2.1 Energy Efficiency

The audit revealed significant reductions in energy consumption due to the installation of solar panels and energyefficient fixtures.

#### 2.2.2 Water Conservation

The audit confirmed the effectiveness of the rainwater harvesting systems and water-saving fixtures, noting a substantial decrease in water usage on campus.

#### 2.2.3 Waste Management

The audit highlighted the success of the waste segregation and recycling programs, with a high percentage of waste being diverted from landfills.

#### 2.2.4 Biodiversity

The expansion of green spaces and the planting of native species have positively impacted campus biodiversity, providing habitats for various flora and fauna. A biodiversity register of the college was prepared in association with TIES (Tropical Institute of Ecological Sciences, Kottayam).

#### 2.2.5 Sustainability Awareness

The audit noted increased awareness and participation in sustainability initiatives among students and staff, indicating the success of educational programs and workshops.

#### 3 Ongoing and Future Initiatives

#### 3.1 Expansion of Renewable Energy

The college plans to expand its solar energy capacity, aiming to meet all its energy needs through renewable sources.

#### 3.2 Enhanced Waste Management

New waste reduction strategies are being developed, including initiatives to further minimize the use of single-use items and increase composting efforts.

To reduce the carbon footprint associated with commuting, the college is exploring options to promote the use of electric vehicles and improve public transportation access.

#### 3.5 Organic Farming

The NSS, along with the College Management, has taken initiatives for organic farming on the campus. Vegetables harvested are sold to students and vendors, promoting sustainable agriculture practices.





#### **Water Audit**

The source of water to the campus is the municipal corporation. The water is tested and reports are shared here. The average consumption of water in the campus is 100-25 kilo liter per day.

The college has taken measures to conserve water through the installation of a rain-water harvesting system with a capture area of the entire building of the campus and the run-off from the harvesting system being collected and used to recharge the rainwater reservoir pond on the campus. It is impressive to note that students and teachers of the Department of Zoology have done a study on the practical application of the root-zone system for sewage treatment as well as the replacement of commercial cleaning agents with bio enzyme cleaning agents made from pineapple and citrus waste.

Waste is thus segregated at source and dry waste is handed over to the agency authorized by the local self-government and empaneled by the State Suchitwa Mission to manage and recycle plastic waste and other dry recyclables like paper.

### **Consolidated Report**

Very rarely has the Green Protocol been so effectively implemented with a strict shift from the culture of plastic disposables towards reuse, reuse, refuse and redesign strategies.

The detailed report above points out the initiatives of the college in important areas as well as makes recommendations on how the institution can move even further towards becoming a green campus in every sense.

### Annexure I – Green Policies of the College

### **Policy on Energy Conservation**

The institution acknowledges the fact that energy is needed for most of the activities that need to be conducted on the campus and the institution in all humility accepts that energy is a valuable resource. Hence at every level the institution strives to make sure that energy and resources are judiciously.

### Lighting and Ventilation

The classrooms and other rooms of the college are well ventilated and well-lit by sunlight during the day time which constitutes almost all the activity for the college. Hence there is minimal if no need to depend on artificial lighting. This goes a long way towards reducing the need for other sources of energy for the purpose of lighting. Care is taken during construction to ensure proper penetration of sunlight as well as cross ventilation limiting the need for air conditioning. In majority of the rooms occupied, s ceiling fan or two ensures circulation of air and limits and almost entirely eliminates the need for air conditioning.

Nevertheless, the college has considered and finalized the need to shift towards installing solar panels and thereby reduce the dependency on the state power supply. This transition towards solar energy is here by recorded as part of the institutions policy towards energy. Solar panels would be installed in phases and at the end of the phased installation, the college hopes to meet its energy needs with the help of solar power.

#### Fossil Fuels

Most of the students and staff depend on public transport or come on foot to the campus, further reducing the need for fossil fuel powered vehicles to be owned and operated by the institution. Hence it has been made policy that the college would not own or operate vehicles to transport staff or students since the college is situated along a bus route and there are plenty of buses plying along the route.

### Main Points on the Policy of Energy Conservation

1. All classrooms and other rooms to be constructed in such a way that there is sufficient natural lighting from the sun and ventilation. This will reduce the need to use electrical devices for lighting and air circulation.

- Reminders Messages to be displayed near all switchboards in classrooms and other rooms to remind users to turn off lights and fans when the room is not occupied.
- 3. Possibilities and potential to install solar panels to be explored. Solar panels to be installed in phases so as to reduce the dependency on the state power supply and make the operations of the college more sustainable and carbon positive.
- 4. Since the college is located along a bus route, private vehicles are discouraged from entry into the campus as a means to encourage more and more staff and students to use public transport. This practice will bring down the carbon foot print of the institution as a whole.

### **Policy on Waste Reduction and Management**

Recognizing that plastic disposables are a major threat to the environment and sound waste management practices can go a long way towards making the campus carbon positive, the following measures have been incorporated into the zero-waste policy of the campus. The college aims to become a zero-waste campus within a period of 5 years.

- All kind of burning is discouraged in the campus. This part of the policy ensures that even dead leaves and garden cuttings do not get burnt and contribute to carbon dioxide emissions. Instead, such garden waste is composted in leaf composters or compost pits.
- 2. Paper is by no means to be burnt but has to be collected and recycling ensured by handing over to scrap dealers who will ensure recycling
- Plastic waste too must not be burnt but is to be handed over to recyclers or government agencies authorized to carry out scientific processing or disposal of plastic waste.
- 4. At the same time, in keeping with the state government's norm of zero waste, The Green Protocol has to be implemented in the campus.
- 5. As part of the Green Protocol, plastic disposables are to be banned on the campus especially disposable plates, cups and straws.
- 6. The college has to take initiative and invest in reusable utensils like steel plates and cups to be used as substitutes for plastic disposables and thus bring down the use of plastic disposables.
- 7. Flex banners have to be banned on the campus.
- 8. Styrofoam decorations and thermocol decorations have to be completely banned.
- 9. A system needs to be set up for the collection of disposable pens that students tend to use and the disposal of these through plastic recyclers.
- 10.E-waste generated on the campus has to be generated and documented. E-waste needs to be properly stored in a closed room with proper roofing. E-waste needs to be disposed only through authorized agencies.
- 11. The furnace and chimney that was originally constructed for burning of garden waste is to be decommissioned and used for some other purpose.
- 12. Sanitary waste like sanitary napkins have to be discouraged in favour of more sustainable practices like the menstrual cup.



- 13. The practice of selling packaged snacks in the canteen has to be stopped. Or the canteen operators need to take the responsibility of the disposal of such packaging generated after the consumption of such snacks.
- 14.Packaged and parceled lunch in plastic packaging is discouraged, and students are encouraged to bring lunch in reusable lunch boxes or packages made of banana leaves.
- 15. Awareness programs have to conducted for the students and staff on days like June 5<sup>th</sup> (World Environment Day) to educated them on the need to reduce waste.

#### 1. ABOUT THE COLLEGE

The Cochin College was founded on July 15, 1967, in response to increasing demand for higher education in western Kochi. The college symbolizes the hopes and aspirations of the public of western Kochi and is a milestone in the crowded history of this commercial town. Slowly and steadily the institution grew into a post graduate college in 1995 from its humble beginning as a junior college in 1967. The college was started by the erstwhile Municipality of Kochi and the Indian Chamber of Commerce, Kochi. The college has been an abode for many generations of students and has a rich heritage of dedicated staff and teachers as well as an enterprising team of management, affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University, boasting a history of five decades.

The Cochin College, located in the west Kochi of Ernakulum District. Cochin College situated at Mattancherry, Kochi and has an area of 31 acres land. The college is affiliated to MG University and offers various courses in both Science and Humanities at the degree level such as Physics, Chemistry, Zoology, Botany, Commerce, Economics, English Literature and Mathematics and self-financing courses offered at degree level are commerce, mathematics, computer application and business administration.

### 2. BIODIVERSITY REGISTER, 2023

The biodiversity register serves as a comprehensive tool designed to analyze the current biodiversity status of the college campus and, subsequently, to formulate plans aimed at enhancing the existing biodiversity. The process involves a biodiversity audit, which entails a thorough assessment of both flora and fauna through spot surveys. This approach not only contributes valuable data but also offers students a unique opportunity for hands-on learning experiences beyond the confines of a traditional classroom setting. Engaging in observational and identification exercises during the audit helps students refine their skills in recognizing and categorizing various plant and animal species.

The biodiversity audit employed a systematic approach, including random transect and quadrant observation walks. These activities allowed the student community to actively participate in classifying the rich biodiversity within the campus. This immersive learning experience creates an environment that is conducive to improving observational skills and deepening understanding. It also provides students with a tangible connection to the natural world, fostering a sense of appreciation and responsibility for the environment.

The results of the biodiversity audit indicate that there is room for improvement in both faunal and floral diversity on the campus. In response to these findings, a planned greening program is proposed. This program aims to enrich the campus environment by introducing more native organisms, thereby enhancing the overall biodiversity. Through these initiatives, the college not only contributes to the preservation of local ecosystems but also offers students a holistic educational experience that extends beyond textbooks, promoting a sense of ecological stewardship and sustainability.

#### 3. AIM

To document the list of flora and fauna of the Cochin college campus and prepare a Campus Biodiversity register.

#### 4. OBJECTIVES

- · To identify the floral and faunal diversity of the college.
- · To estimate the density of the selected taxon and prepare a biodiversity register for the college

### 5. METHODOLOGY

Spot survey method was employed to assess diversity of selected taxon in the college campus. An expert from TIES and selected volunteer students from the college conducted a walk through survey and enumerated biodiversity, covering nook and corners of the campus. The surveyed taxa includes trees, shrubs and herbs; birds, butterflies and odonates (dragonflies & damselflies). The field survey was conducted during the period April 2023. Data was recorded, analyzed and prepared the reports.

#### 6. RESULTS AND OBSERVATION

Cochin College has very limited land (31 acres), and the campus is mainly occupied with buildings, ground and roads. Hence, at present relatively low biodiversity is existing in the campus.

### 6.1 Floral diversity of the campus

The campus has diverse plant life, A significant contributor to this botanical richness is the Herbal Garden, which stands as a focal point for the campus's overall floral diversity. Within this cultivated space, particular attention is drawn to the noteworthy density of key species such as Polyalthia longifolia, Mangifera indica, Swietenia macrophylla, Syzygium cumini, Tectona grandis, and Samanea saman, which exhibit the highest numbers in terms of population. In totality, a remarkable total of 123 distinct plant species flourish across the campus, contributing to a vibrant and dynamic ecological landscape. For a comprehensive understanding of the campus's botanical makeup, detailed information regarding the diversity and density of each individual plant species is meticulously provided below. This comprehensive documentation underscores the richness and importance of the diverse plant life that enhances the environmental quality of the campus.

Similar to the majority of college campuses in Kerala, almost all the trees found in the campus are planted during various years. A concerted effort is required to improve the biodiversity of the campus. Thematic biodiversity gardens like bamboo fence, native fruit trees, native shade trees, shall be installed in the campus. This will definitely improve the biodiversity of the campus.

### Faunal diversity of the campus

The faunal diversity within the campus is relatively low, primarily influenced by the geographical characteristics of the area and a relatively sparse floral variety. The present survey enumerated the status of birds, butterflies, and odonates in the campus. Unfortunately, the findings indicate that both butterfly and odonate diversity are relatively quite low. This can be attributed, in part, to the unique landscape of coastal area, where campus is located. Coastal areas typically exhibit lower species diversity when compared to midland and highland regions. Adding to the challenges, the presence of a canal surrounding the college compounds the issue. The water in the canal is heavily polluted, primarily due to waste discharge from households and shops. This pollution is anticipated to have a detrimental impact on the diversity of water birds and odonates, further contributing to the overall limitation of faunal diversity within the campus. Efforts to address these environmental factors could potentially enhance the campus's ecological balance and foster a more diverse and sustainable faunal community.

More thematic garden like butterfly garden, a small pond of good quality water and aquatic plants for egg laying of odonates will certainly improve the biodiversity of the campus.

### Birds of the Cochin college campus

The avian (bird) diversity of the campus is moderate, characterized by the presence of only a limited number of common bird species. The observed bird species in the campus are given in Table 2. However, the diversity of water birds (aquatic birds) is particularly scarce, a consequence of the highly polluted water body encircling the campus. This pollution has a discernible impact on the water bird population, contributing to the overall reduction in avian diversity. Notwithstanding the overall lower diversity, certain bird species exhibit a notable prevalence within the campus. The House crow, Black kite, Brahminy kite, and Rock pigeon, in particular, demonstrate a high density, making them prominent residents in the area. These observations shed light on the nuanced interplay between environmental factors, specifically the water quality, and the distribution and abundance of bird species in the study area. Addressing water pollution and implementing conservation measures could potentially improve the conditions for avian diversity in the campus.

Over the course of the survey conducted in the campus, a total of 26 bird species were identified. While this figure may seem relatively modest, it represents a more robust avian diversity in comparison to the observed diversity of butterflies and odonates in the same area. The disparity highlights that, despite the apparent limitation in the number of bird species, the campus serves as a more conducive habitat for avian life as opposed to certain other insect groups. This contrast may be attributed to various ecological factors, such as vegetation types, food sources, and nesting opportunities that are more favorable for birds. Understanding these nuances in species distribution across different taxa is crucial for a comprehensive assessment of the campus's ecological dynamics, providing valuable insights into the biodiversity and ecological balance within the study area.

### Butterfly Diversity of the campus

The butterfly diversity within the campus is notably limited, and this is primarily attributed to the insufficient presence of both nectarine and host plants essential for attracting and sustaining butterflies. Nectarine plants provide a crucial food source for adult butterflies, while host plants serve as habitats for their eggs and caterpillars. The scarcity of these specific plant types in the campus creates a less-than-ideal environment for butterflies to thrive. Additionally, the overall lack of herbs and shrubs further diminishes the available habitat and resources for these delicate insects.

The survey identified a mere nine species of butterflies in the campus, and all of them are characterized as common. This further underscores the impact of the limited plant diversity on the butterfly population. Enhancing the variety and abundance of nectarine and host plants, as well as promoting the growth of herbs and shrubs, could potentially provide a more hospitable environment for a greater diversity of butterflies, fostering a healthier and more vibrant ecosystem within the campus. Addressing these ecological aspects is crucial for promoting biodiversity and supporting the various species that contribute to the overall ecological balance.

### Odonate Diversity of the campus

The campus exhibits notably low odonate diversity, and this deficiency extends to the scarcity of individuals within each species. The survey identified merely four species of odonates, and the numbers of individuals within each species were found to be less than three. This paucity is indicative of a constrained and less favorable environment for these dragonflies and damselflies. The presence of a canal encircling the campus and a pond within it adds an aquatic dimension to the habitat.

Unfortunately, the water quality in the canal is a significant factor contributing to the limited odonate diversity. The canal water is highly polluted, primarily due to the discharge of waste from households and shops. This pollution is starkly evident in the dragonfly species observed, specifically the Ditch Jewel (*Brachythemis contaminata*), which is known to thrive in contaminated water. The dominance of this particular species reflects the compromised water quality in the canal around the campus.

This situation underscores the crucial interplay between environmental conditions, specifically water quality, and the health of odonate populations. Addressing the pollution in the water body could potentially improve the habitat for odonates, fostering a more diverse and resilient population in the campus ecosystem.




Fig. 9. Brachythemis contaminata

#### 7. CONCLUSION

The survey results revealed that the campus currently exhibits a relatively low level of biodiversity. Among the identified species, there were 123 plant species, 9 butterfly species, 4 odonate species, and 26 bird species. The limited diversity observed in these categories indicated the need for focused conservation efforts to enrich and sustain the ecosystem.

The biodiversity survey usually serves as a critical tool for understanding and improving the biological richness of an area. This will help to implement necessary management and conservation strategies in a sustainable manner, with the ultimate goal of enhancing biodiversity within the campus. The findings from the survey provided valuable insights on the current state of floral and faunal diversity.

One notable observation was the low diversity of odonate sightings during the survey, suggesting a potential concern regarding water quality. Odonates are often sensitive indicators of environmental health, and their absence could be attributed to high pollution levels in and around the campus. This emphasizes the importance of addressing pollution issues, particularly in water bodies such as ponds and canals, to create a more conducive and sustainable environment for a diverse range of species.

Biodiversity contributes significantly towards various ecological services and provides aesthetics to the campus. College shall formulate a Biodiveristy policy for the campus with a thrust to the promotion of native local species. An action plan also may be drafted and implemented in a phase wise manner in order to enhance the campus biodiversity, surpassing all kinds of limitations.

1. Introduction 1-6-2022

This policy document outlines the guidelines and regulations for Anti Narcotic Cell at The Cochin College. It serves as a reference for club members, officers, and advisors to ensure the smooth functioning and compliance of the club with the policies and procedures of the college.

### 2. Purpose and Objectives

#### 2.1 Purpose

The Anti Narcotic Cell was established in this institution in the year 2017. # Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) for Chemistry Laboratory The Cochin College.

#### **Purpose**

This SOP provides standard operating procedures for handling chemicals and apparatus in the Chemistry Department laboratory. It supplements routine safety precautions to ensure a safe and efficient working environment.

#### 1. Responsibilities of Students

- 1. **Understand Instructions:** Ensure you fully comprehend all instructions before beginning any laboratory work.
- 2. **Authorization and Supervision:** Do not perform unauthorized experiments or work alone in the laboratory.
- 3. **Personal Protective Equipment (PPE):** Always wear appropriate PPE, including a laboratory coat or apron. Legs must be completely covered below the knee by clothing.
- 4. Hair and Clothing: Secure long hair and loose clothing while in the laboratory.
- 5. Footwear: Open-toed shoes, backless shoes, slingbacks, clogs, and sandals are prohibited.
- 6. **Safety Equipment:** Know the location and proper use of fire extinguishers, fire blankets, and first aid kits.
- 7. Chemical Handling: Carefully read labels on reagent bottles before handling any chemicals.
- 8. Prohibited Activities: Eating, smoking, and drinking are strictly forbidden in the laboratory.
- 9. **Storage:** Do not store food in laboratory refrigerators; they are for chemicals only.
- 10. Fume Hoods: Use fume hoods or exhaust fans when working with toxic or irritating vapors.
- 11. **Glassware Handling:** Do not force glass tubing through corks or rubber stoppers without proper lubrication.
- 12. Test Tubes: Never direct the open end of a test tube toward yourself or others.
- 13. Acid Handling: Always add acid to water, not water to acid, to avoid violent reactions.
- 14. **Burner Safety:** Learn the proper procedure for igniting and operating a laboratory burner. Extinguish the flame when not in use, and ensure flammable reagents are removed before lighting the burner.
- 15. **Weighing Chemicals:** Always use a proper container when weighing chemicals. Never pour chemicals directly over the balance.
- 16. **Unused Chemicals:** Do not return unused chemicals to their original containers unless instructed by the teacher.
- 17. Reagent Containers: Securely replace lids, caps, and stoppers after using reagents.
- 18. Spatula Use: Clean spatulas before and after inserting them into reagent bottles.

- 19. Accidents: Immediately report any accident or injury, however minor, to your instructor.
- 20. **Workspace Management:** Keep your workspace clear of non-essential items to prevent interference with your experiments.
- 21. Personal Belongings: Store personal items on shelves upon entering the laboratory.
- 22. **Spill Management:** Clean up spills immediately with assistance from the Laboratory Assistant.
- 23. **End of Lab Protocol:** Before leaving, clean and dry your workspace, and ensure all gas, water, vacuum, and air valves are turned off.
- 24. Hygiene: Wash your hands thoroughly before leaving the laboratory.

#### 2. Responsibilities of Teachers

- 1. SOP Awareness: Ensure students have read and understood the SOP.
- 2. **Chemical Knowledge:** Make sure students are aware of the chemical characteristics through Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) and understand safe handling procedures.
- 3. **Safety Awareness:** Teachers must also be aware of the safe handling procedures for each chemical used in the laboratory.
- 4. Safety Norms: Ensure students do not violate safety norms.

#### 3. Responsibilities of Laboratory Staff

- 1. **Lab Maintenance:** Ensure that the assigned work is completed and the laboratory is properly organized.
- 2. Safety Responsibility: Be vigilant regarding the safety of students and colleagues.
- 3. Alertness: Maintain constant alertness while in the laboratory.
- 4. Chemical Handling: Safely handle all chemicals.
- 5. Understanding Symbols: Be familiar with the meanings of chemical symbols on bottles.
- 6. **Chemical Knowledge:** Understand the nature of each chemical used in the laboratory and store them accordingly.
- 7. **Hazardous Chemical Storage:** Store all hazardous chemicals separately to prevent dangerous reactions, explosions, or fires.
- 8. **Monitoring:** Observe how students and colleagues handle chemicals, and take appropriate action if safety norms are violated.
- 9. Spill Management: Clean up chemical spills immediately with care.
- 10. **Emergency Evacuation:** Evacuate students to safety in case of emergency.
- 11. **Chemical Handling:** Do not touch chemicals with bare hands; always use a spatula or dropper.
- 12. **Chemical Conservation:** Avoid wasting chemicals, and reuse leftover solutions whenever possible.

#### 4. Housekeeping

- 1. Cleanliness: The laboratory must be kept neat and clean at all times.
- 2. Organization: Apparatus and chemicals should be stored in their designated places.
- 3. **Workspace:** Keep the working bench free from unnecessary items, such as paper, chemicals, and waste.
- 4. Spill Response: Keep a cleaning duster handy for immediate cleanup of spills.
- Pathways: Ensure that no stools or other obstacles block the pathways between working tables.
- 6. Exit Access: Keep all paths to exits clear and unobstructed.
- 7. Labeling: Label all chemical containers for easy identification.
- 8. Glassware: Handle broken glassware with care.
- 9. **Apparatus Cleaning:** Clean all apparatus before storing them in lockers or returning them to the counter.
- 10. End of Lab Cleanup: Thoroughly clean your work area before leaving the lab.
- 11. **Return Equipment:** Return boss clamps, wire gauze, tripod stands, and other equipment to their designated places.
- 12. Chemical Storage: Return bottles of chemicals to their designated places.
- Solution Management: Return unused (clean) solutions to the stock from which they were taken.

#### 5. Accident and Injury

#### A. Prevention

- 1. Alertness: Stay alert while working in the laboratory.
- 2. **Test Tube Safety:** Do not point test tubes containing boiling liquid toward others.
- 3. **Chemical Handling:** Always handle chemicals with appropriate tools like a spatula or dropper.
- 4. Skin and Clothing: Prevent chemicals from contacting your skin or clothing.
- 5. Chemical Inhalation and Ingestion: Do not inhale or taste chemicals.
- 6. Chemical Reactions: Do not mix chemicals without understanding their reactions.

#### **Chemicals in the Eyes**

- Do not rub the eyes.
- Hold eyelids open and flush with water for 15 minutes.
- Avoid contaminating the other eye.
- Seek additional medical attention.

#### Chemicals on the Skin

- Flush the affected area with lukewarm water for 15 minutes.
- Remove clothing and jewelry from the burn area.
- Seek additional medical attention.

#### **Chemical Inhalation**

- Move the victim to fresh air.
- Seek immediate medical attention.

#### **Chemical Ingestion**

- Do not induce vomiting unless instructed by Poison Control.
- Seek immediate medical attention.

#### SOP for Waste Disposal: Non-Hazardous, Acid and Base Chemical Management

#### 1. General Guidelines

- Waste Segregation: Separate waste by type (non-hazardous, acidic, basic). Do not mix different types of waste unless instructed.
- Labelling: Clearly label waste containers with the type of waste, chemical name, concentration, and date of collection.

#### 2. Non-Hazardous Chemical Waste Management

- Identification: Confirm waste is non-hazardous via SDS or lab supervisor.
- Collection: Use designated containers for liquid and solid non-hazardous waste.
- Disposal:
  - Liquids: If permitted, dilute with water and dispose of down the drain, flushing with ample water.
  - o **Solids:** Dispose of in regular trash if no environmental or health risks are posed.

#### 3. Acid Waste Management

- Collection: Use acid-resistant containers for acidic waste.
- **Neutralization (if required):** Neutralize acids by adding to cold water, then slowly add a neutralizing agent until neutral pH is achieved.

#### 4. Basic Waste Management

- Collection: Use containers resistant to caustic substances for basic waste.
- Neutralization (if required): Carefully neutralize bases using a weak acid, and then dispose of according to regulations.
- Disposal: Neutralized waste may be disposed of down the drain if permitted. Nonneutralized waste should be stored for professional disposal.

#### 5. Handling and Safety Precautions

- PPE: Wear appropriate PPE, including lab coats, gloves, and safety goggles.
- Ventilation: Ensure good ventilation when handling waste; use fume hoods if necessary.
- Spill Management: Follow spill response procedures, using appropriate neutralizing agents and absorbent materials for cleanup.

### Citizen Science Program (REVIVAL) (Rehabilitation of Vibrio Infested Waters of Vembanad Lake-Pollution and Solution):

In a bid to promote citizen science initiatives, the Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute (CMFRI) launched the REVIVAL project (Rehabilitation of Vibrio Infested Waters of Vembanad Lake - Pollution and Solution). This multiinstitutional research project invited college students and the public to participate in optical mapping of the Vembanad Lake. The project's objectives include understanding the extent of pathogenic Vibrio pollution, identifying their reservoirs in the ecosystem, mapping the distribution of Vibrio carriers using remote-sensing techniques, and developing forecast models to anticipate microbial infection hotspots. Data collection was facilitated using a Secchi disc, a simple hand-held device to measure water turbidity, and a mobile app named TurbAqua was developed for uploading the data. On 8th November 2023, 32 first-year UG students from the Department of Zoology, The Cochin College attended an orientation session for the Citizen Science Program organised by Ms. Ancy C Stoy, a Research Scholar at CMFRI, where Secchi disks were distributed. The students also underwent a comprehensive training session at CMFRI on 24th January 2024, equipping them with the skills necessary to contribute effectively to this important environmental initia-
