
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2 "Hands on Training - Vermicompositing," (2023-24,February 10, Participant No. 44)

On 10 February 2023, a practical training session on vermicomposting was successfully conducted in collaboration with the Department of Zoology at The Cochin College. This hands-on workshop was designed to introduce students to effective methods of solid waste management through vermicomposting, an environmentally friendly technique that utilizes earthworms to decompose organic waste.

A total of 31 students participated in the session, which aimed to provide them with practical skills and knowledge on how to implement and manage a vermicomposting system. The training included a detailed demonstration of the process, including setting up a composting bin, maintaining optimal conditions for earthworms, and managing the composting process to produce nutrient-rich soil.

This session was part of an ongoing effort to extend learning beyond the classroom, following up on insights gained from the Q1 market field visit. By integrating practical waste management techniques into their skill set, students were empowered to contribute to sustainable practices in their communities.

The session was attended by 41 students and 3 faculty members, reflecting a strong interest in practical skill development and environmental sustainability. Overall, the training provided valuable hands-on experience and reinforced the importance of sustainable waste management practices.

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
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3 "Seminar on Entrepreneurship Skill, Attitude and Behaviour Development," (2023-24,February 7, Participant No. 42)

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
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5 Field/Exposure Visit to Incubation Unit/Patent Facilitation Centre/

On March 21, 2023, the Department of Electronics, in collaboration with the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) and the Young Innovators Programme (YIP), organized a field visit to Maker Village, an Electronics Hardware Incubator at Kinfra IT Park. This event was part of the Tata Social Enterprise Challenge (TSEC) hosted by the Indian Institute of Management (IIM) Calcutta Innovation Park.

The visit, attended by 52 students and 3 faculty members, included a half-day "Spark Social" seminar held in the Amphi Theatre, Integrated Startup Complex, Kalamassery. The seminar was designed to connect participants with the broader innovation ecosystem and provide insights into social entrepreneurship. 
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9 Project Presentation By Post Graduate Students," (2023-2024, June 22 June 26,2023, Participants No :25


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10 Simplifying Research," (2023-2024, October 14 - October 14,2023,Participants No :60


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Fundamentals of Hypothesis Testing," (2023-2024, March4 -March 4,2024, Participants No :26


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Validation and Innovation -Field/Exposure Visit to Maker Village (2022-23, March 21 - March 21, Participant No: 55)

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

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


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"Celebrating India's Presidency of the G20" (2022-23, August 31- August 31, Participant No. 30)

On December 5, 2022, a one-day offline field visit was organized, focusing on problem identification and real-world problem-solving. The event, conducted in association with the Department of Zoology at The Cochin College, included 46 students and 3 faculty members.

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53 Achieving Problem-Solution Fit Product-Market Fit (2021-22, May

7 - May 7, Participant No: 30)

The session on "Achieving Problem-Solution Fit & Product-Market Fit" was centered around the innovative BIOMAG-2018 project, a model initiative addressing the critical issue of solid waste management in densely populated communities. Chosen as a prime example of how to achieve both problem-solution and product-market fit, BIOMAG-2018 introduced a groundbreaking approach to waste segregation and utilization, effectively turning waste into wealth.

The project tackled the challenge of waste management by introducing a systematic method of segregating biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste. Biodegradable waste was directed towards vermicomposting or other home composting techniques, producing organic fertilizer that not only promotes environmental sustainability but also serves as a potential source of income. The non-biodegradable waste underwent further segregation into recyclable and non-recyclable categories. Recyclable materials were sold through local vendors, while non-recyclable items were creatively upcycled into products such as bags, rags, and pots, thereby generating additional income and employment opportunities.

This session was particularly impactful as it showcased how a well-conceived project like BIOMAG-2018 can address a significant societal issue while simultaneously creating economic opportunities. The idea of generating income and employment from waste was presented in a manner that felt almost magical to the audience, inspiring them to rethink waste management and its potential benefits. 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
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
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
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59 IPR AWARENESS – Problem Solving Event (2021-22, 26 - April 26 April Participant No: 63)


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
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
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National Technology Day (2021-22,11 May -11 May Participant No: 28)

On 11th May 2022, The Cochin College celebrated National Technology Day with the launch of an innovative tool, DutyBase V1.0, developed by the Digital Solutions Committee in collaboration with the Exam Committee, TCC-IIC, and IQAC. DutyBase V1.0 is an Integrated Exam Duty Management System designed to automate and streamline the process of exam duty allotment, notification, and logging. The system features a live dashboard that displays exam duties for all faculty members starting from January 2022. Faculty members can access this system using their Gsuite IDs to check their duty status in real-time.

The Exam Committee can leverage the system to automatically generate and publish the exam duty list for upcoming university exams. The duty lists are then disseminated via email to the respective faculty members and securely archived in the system's database. The system is built on Google Sheets, utilizing Javascript coding for seamless operation and integration.

This year's National Technology Day celebration was marked by the official release of the DutyBase system, which is expected to significantly enhance the efficiency and transparency of exam duty management at the college. The successful implementation of this system reflects the college's commitment to leveraging technology for improving academic administration.

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

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
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My Story - Motivational Session by Successful Innovators.(2021-22,12 March -12 March , Participant No: 35)


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64 My Story - Business Model Canvas (BMC).(2021-22,9 May -9 May , Participant No: 96)

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
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
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71 Webinar on Literature Search and Reference Management," (2021-2022, July 24 - July 24,2021, Participants No :98

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
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73 INSPIRATIONS Session Three," (2020-2021,February 22 - February 22,Participant No :35)


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


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78 ECO HUES," (2019-2020, February 20 - February 20, Participant No :30)

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


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79 Pepper Sav," (2019-2020, January 30- January 30, Participant No :350
