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





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6 Water Quality Analysis

On World Water Day, March 22, 2023 the BMS Club conducted a Water Quality Analysis to assess the potability of various drinking water sources around Fort Kochi. This initiative aimed to ensure the availability of safe drinking water for the community. The analysis Involved collecting water samples from different locations, including public wells, household taps, and natural springs. These samples were tested for various parameters such as pH levels, turbidity, microbial content, and the presence of harmful chemicals and heavy metals. The results were compared against standard guidelines for potable water to determine their safety. Preliminary findings indicated that while some sources met the safety standards, others showed contamination levels that could pose health risks. Public wells, in particular, exhibited higher levels of microbial contamination, necessitating immediate attention and potential remediation measures. In addition to the water quality analysis, BMS Club members observed World Water Day by placing earthen bowls filled with water in different locations for birds and animals. This act of compassion aimed to highlight the importance of water for all living beings and to promote awareness about water conservation and wildlife support. The event was well-received, with community members appreciating the dual focus on human health and ecological welfare. The BMS Club's efforts underscored the critical need for ongoing water quality monitoring and the implementation of measures to ensure access to safe drinking water for everyone in Fort Kochi.











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
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9 Yoga For Health And Wellness
