8 Report on Extension Activities Conducted by The Cochin College (2019-2020)

Throughout the academic year 2019-2020, The Cochin College, under the leadership of the NSS, Department of Zoology, and other student bodies, actively organized and participated in a wide range of programs focusing on environmental awareness, social responsibility, health care, and community service. These activities fostered a sense of civic duty and personal development among students, aligning with the college's mission to cultivate holistic education.

The year began with the Environment Day Celebration on 5 June 2019, followed by Yoga Day on 21 June 2019, both organized by the NSS to promote physical well-being and environmental consciousness. Another key event was the observance of the International Day for Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking on 26 June 2019, raising awareness about the harmful effects of drug abuse.

As part of the environmental sustainability initiatives, the college celebrated Vanamahotsav Day on 1 July 2019, encouraging students to plant trees and contribute to ecological conservation. The World Social Media Day was observed on 8 July 2019, emphasizing the responsible use of digital platforms.

On 15 August 2019, the Independence Day celebrations were marked with great enthusiasm, followed by Flood Relief Activities on 16 August 2019, where NSS volunteers extended their support to the flood-affected regions. Teachers' Day was celebrated on 5 September 2019, honoring the contributions of faculty members to the institution.

The Blood Donation Camp on 26 September 2019 and the Railway Swachhata Programme on 4 November 2019 demonstrated the college's commitment to public health and cleanliness. A notable health initiative was the establishment of the Pain and Palliative Care Unit on 28 November 2019, reflecting the NSS's dedication to serving those in need.

To raise awareness about local tourism, a program was organized on 30 November 2019 focusing on the Tourism Development in Chellanam. Additionally, the Beach Cleaning Drive at Fort Kochi Beach on 10 December 2019 highlighted the institution's environmental stewardship.

The college continued its mission of health and social awareness with the Palliative Care Day on 5 January 2020 and a Drug Awareness Programme on 7 February 2020, both focusing on critical social issues. The Coronavirus Awareness Programme on 11 February 2020 educated students on the early measures for COVID-19 prevention. This was followed by a Pre-Orientation Camp on 13 February 2020 to prepare new NSS volunteers for their future roles.

The Department of Zoology organized significant academic initiatives, including the BIOMAG program and the CUBE Student Scientist Program in December 2020, fostering research and innovation among students. The department also hosted a Workshop on Environment and Sustainable Development Through Healthy Practices from 7-10 January 2020, in collaboration with the Nature Club, to promote sustainable living. Field trips such as the Institute Visits to MTCC and CSIR-IMTECH on 4 March 2020 provided students with hands-on scientific exposure.



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In conclusion, the array of activities conducted during 2019-2020 demonstrates The Cochin College's commitment to social responsibility, environmental sustainability, and academic excellence. Through these programs, the students developed a deeper understanding of community service, personal well-being, and scientific inquiry, reflecting the holistic education ethos of the institution.
