5 INIZIO 2020 - Student Induction Program

One of the key events was the celebration of International Yoga Day on 21 June 2021, organized by the NSS, emphasizing the importance of physical and mental well-being through yoga practices. Additionally, the NSS conducted an Online Seven-Day Camp, "Unarvu" from January 23-29, 2021, which included a variety of sessions such as a Yoga Session (25 January 2021), Covid-19 Prevention Measures (26 January 2021), and Classes on Innovative Farming Methods (27 January 2021). The camp also featured community initiatives like the Distribution of Hand Sanitizers and Masks and Personal Hygiene and Immunity Improvement Sessions, all held in January 2021.

In response to the ongoing pandemic, the college conducted a Webinar on Covid Vaccination on 26 October 2021 to educate the community on the importance of vaccines, followed by a Covid Vaccination Drive on 3 December 2021, organized by the Covid Monitoring Committee. These efforts were crucial in promoting health and safety during the pandemic.

The college also organized programs focusing on women's empowerment and social justice. A Workshop on the POCSO Act, Dowry, and Women Empowerment was held on 2 February 2022 by the NSS, aiming to create awareness about women's rights

and protection. Furthering its commitment to health education, the Department of Malayalam conducted an Awareness Class on Menstrual Health Practices on 18 October 2022, promoting knowledge about menstrual hygiene.

The NSS, in partnership with the Career Guidance Cell, held a Webinar on 17 December 2022 to guide students on career planning and opportunities. The Film Club also organized an Anti-Drugs Campaign on 5-6 January 2022, spreading awareness about the dangers of drug abuse.

Environmental sustainability was another focus area for the college. The Bhoomithrasena Club organized a Beach Cleaning and Tree Planting Drive at Fort Kochi on 25 February 2022, demonstrating the college's commitment to environmental conservation. The College Library also contributed to intellectual growth by organizing events like the 'Commemoration of Ponkunnam Varkey' and a Talk on 'Academic Libraries' on 30 June 2021, and a session on Career Prospects in Library Science on 8 April 2022. In summary, The Cochin College has made significant contributions to health, education, empowerment, and environmental sustainability through its wide range of activities and initiatives during the year 2021-2022. These events provided valuable opportunities for students to engage in community service, build awareness on important societal issues, and acquire skills that will benefit them in their academic and professional pursuits.
